Narrative

Bend Fire Department responded to a reported structure fire in an apartment on the west side of Bend, early this afternoon. Upon arrival, crews found smoke on the second floor, occupants evacuated to the parking lot and the smoke alarm sounding. Upon further investigation, crews found a malfunctioning wall-mounted heater/air conditioner adjacent to the elevator shaft. There was no fire, only smoke. Firefighters removed the unit from the wall and opened the surrounding wallboard to ensure that no heat or fire had extended into the stud spaces. They also removed the smoke from the building. Occupants were released to re-enter the building within about an hour of the alarm. Bend Fire reminds you that when you hear a smoke alarm sounding, do not ignore it. It is doing its job of telling you that something is wrong and needs immediate attention. When you leave a building because of a fire, remember to CLOSE THE DOOR, to restrict the amount of air a fire can get.
